The Graduate Program in Sociology focuses on social processes and structures in Australia and other industrialised countries, on processes of development in non-Western societies, and on themes in sociological theory. It aims to develop both theoretical and empirical social research skills and to encourage both quantitative and qualitative approaches. Major research fields within the Program include equality of opportunity and relative equity, education in national development, social mobility, social and health policy, gender, ethnic and life cycle inequalities, sociology of health and medicine, social networks, political and social attitudes, immigrants in the labour market, social structure and political relations in Eastern Europe, and sociological theory.

The Australian National University is in close proximity to Federal Parliament, government departments, the headquarters of many national bodies, other national organisations such as the Institute of Criminology and the Australian Bureau of Statistics, and other tertiary institutions including the University of Canberra and the Australian Defence Force Academy.

2. General description of the discipline:

Tourism Studies at Central Queensland University was developed and is taught primarily by sociologists. The Tourism staff includes five full time staff members and other sessional staff members. Not all members have degrees in sociology. There are two options for studying Tourism - a Bachelor of Tourism and a tourism stream in the MBA program. The teaching of the tourism program adopts an interdisciplinary program of study, which incorporates the concepts, and methods of the social sciences (such as sociology, social psychology, geography) and several business-related disciplines (such as marketing, economics). Both programs of study aim to provide students with knowledge and understanding of the complexity of the tourism industry; multidisciplinary skills for studying tourism and an ability to critically examine the influent and impacts of tourism contemporary society.

Tourism is available on the university's campuses in Rockhampton and Mackay in full time and part time mode. It is also offered at CQU International campus locations in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Fiji. Tourism may also be studied in the external mode, that is, by correspondence. On-line offerings are currently being negotiated for development. Students who have completed some components of the course have obtained employment in tourism related government departments and agencies and in the private sector.

General description of the school 2.

The School of Anthropology, Archaeology and Sociology has recently been established as a separate entity within the Faculty of Arts, Education and Social Sciences, although the teaching of anthropology, archaeology and sociology date back to the early 1970s. Since 1992 a full sociology undergraduate program has been in place at the Townsville campus, and, since 1997, at the Cairns campus. Teaching specialities presently include such areas at the deviance and social control, gender, health and illness, popular culture, religion, social movements, work and management, and youth cultures; environmental and rural sociology; ethnicity, immigration and social problems; classical, contemporary and modern social science theory; social analysis and survey methodologies.







Anthropological research focuses on Aboriginal and Islander Australia, Melanesia, Native North America and the Philippines as well as on Australian and Meso-American archaeology, development studies, and gender and cultural studies.




