Research Title:

COMPORTMENT, CONTENTION, AND CONFLICT: IDENTITY AND ROLE DYNAMICS EXPERIENCED BY BILINGUAL-BICULTURAL SOCIAL WORK PRACTITIONERS IN AUSTRALIAN PRACTICE CONTEXTS.

Do you identify as a Bilingual-Bicultural Social Worker?

You may be qualified to participate in a voluntary research study if you

- Are a qualified Social Worker, with 2+ years of fulltime work experience, in the Australian human services context.
- Meet the AASW requirements as a qualified Social Worker.
- Work with your own cultural community in an Ethno-Specific and/or a mainstream human service organisation.

RESEARCH AIMS:

- 1) To give voice to the lived experiences of bilingual-bicultural social workers who do practice within and across their own non-dominant cultural communities.
- 2) To explore such practitioner experiences as: potential cultural tensions and/or conflicts within their professional communities, tensions or conflicts between mainstream professional practice expectations and cultural considerations, professional/cultural senses of identity and affiliation, and role-bound identity of being a cultural insider-outsider.

YOU WILL YOU BE ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN:

- 1) a virtual Semi-Structured Individual Interview, and 2) a virtual Focus Group discussion, with further information being provided ahead of time for the actual interviews.

DURATION: Interviews will be from 45-60 minutes long.
